Hurricane Preparation

We are approaching the start of hurricane season. Hurricane shutters are the best investment you can make to protect your property and yourself. The Board encourages you to install approved hurricane shutters if you do not already have them.

BEFORE: a hurricane makes landfall shelter arrangements should be made if needed. Make arrangement for pets, install shutters, fill fuel tanks, freeze extra ice, fill tub with water, have a two-week supply of non-perishable food. Secure property by bringing outdoor items inside or properly securing (boat, trailers, etc). Check trees and/or shrubbery, trim and remove limbs that could Duct Tape damage your house or utilities lines. Trimming should be performed now, prior to hurricane announcement.

DURING: a hurricane stay inside at all times. Stay away from windows and exterior doors .In a one-story home, the strongest room is often a bathroom or walk-in closet near the center of the house, which is often best to be made Soap as a safe room.

AFTER: a hurricane make temporary repairs to protect home, contact your insurance company & FEMA for damages. Before hiring contractors you should verify license & insurance with the Town of Jupiter Building Department (561)-741-2286.

Security Committee Alert



Jupiter Harbour has always been a safe and secure place to live. Unfortunately, about a month ago there were two reports of break-ins in a condo building. It is believed that access to Jupiter Harbour was gained by an intruder coming around a fence and through bushes at the water line. The POA Board and POA Security Committee are looking at ways to prevent future access in this area and throughout our property.

About 75% of Jupiter Harbour is surrounded by water. This makes it very difficult to completely eliminate access unless we spend an exorbitant amount of money on additional staff to patrol the property and cameras and security staff to monitor the cameras.

During a walk-thru of Jupiter Harbour by representatives of the Jupiter Police Department, they said there are several key areas where we should focus our attention. The first four are mainly the responsibility of each association.

Lighting Fencing Signage Shrubbery

The fifth is one of the most important. That is **PERSONAL RESPONSIBILITY**.

Here are examples of what each of us can do to protect our homes and ourselves.

- \Rightarrow Lock all doors and windows
- \Rightarrow Keep garage doors and storage units closed and locked
- \Rightarrow Install an alarm system and activate it each time you leave
- ⇒ Cancel newspapers when away
- \Rightarrow Inform your neighbors when you're away
- ⇒ Ask a friend, neighbor or pay a professional to check your home if you're out of town for an extended period of time
- \Rightarrow Call 911 if you see anything or anyone suspicious
- \Rightarrow If you have outdoor lights, be sure they are working
- \Rightarrow Do not leave valuable items outside on terraces, boats, docks, decks or walkways
- \Rightarrow Do not give out access gate codes or leave gates open (Marina area)

As the Jupiter Chief of Police said in our last newsletter, "remember, we can't do it alone, we need your help."
