Hurricane Irma Debris Removal Notice

Thank you for your continued patience as we work through the debris collection process. As a reminder, please follow the instructions below for handling regular yard debris as well as storm-related debris piles. **Do not dump any debris onto public rights-of-way for collection.** We will send a debris removal update towards the end of the week.

Debris Collection Tips

There are a number of ways you can help to ensure that the debris collection process goes smoothly.

Separate your piles

Vegetative debris, structural debris and bagged materials should be in separate piles and not mixed or placed on top of each other. **Please allow at least a couple of feet between the piles so that our equipment can efficiently pick up the appropriate debris.**



Please do not place pick-up piles near or around any structures such as fire hydrants, poles, trees, mailboxes, etc. so our equipment can properly remove debris.

Bag small vegetative debris

The equipment being used to collect and remove debris is not designed to scoop up piles of smaller vegetative debris. As a rule of thumb, if you can fit it into a bag, please do so. You can set the bagged debris out for your regular trash collection (which will may be picked up before the storm-related debris trucks can get to your neighborhood).

Please do not combine fresh/green vegetation trimmings with storm-related vegetative debris - these must be maintained separately in order for FEMA to assist with the expense of storm-related debris removal, which translates into significant cost-savings for the Town.



Stay safe when putting out storm debris

When disposing of air-tight appliances such as refrigerators, freezers, clothes washers, and clothes dryers, be sure to **remove all doors**. Please do not allow children to play on or around debris piles, as they may be hazardous.
